Saugatuck Couple Drowns In Gulf Of Mexico Storm Yacht Breaks Up In High Seas

SAUGATUCK -- The bodies | of a man and woman, found in the Gulf of Mexico Thursday boat, have been identified as Mr. and Mrs. Walter L. Coburn. both about 50, owners of Saugatuck's largest motel.

The bodies were found by the Coast Guard, ending a search that began Tuesday when the Coast Guard air station at St. Petersburg, Fla., picked up a distress call.

The alarm was received at 2:30 p.m. from a man who said that his boat, the Cara Mia, "is breaking up and taking on water." The location was given as seven hours, 13 minutes, out of Apalachiola, Fla., (northern section of the state) headed to Clearwater (midway on the state's west coast, near Tampa).
